The AVATAR Lab, supported by Mursion, is a mixed reality platform that is a unique blend of human and artificial intelligence. As with all technology, there are certain things the AVATARs can and cannot do.

AVATARS CANNOT:

- Answer as a group
- Stand up
- · Hold their papers/iPads up
- Change seating

AVATARS CAN:

- Talk in groups
- Solve problems
- Hold conversations with you
- · Raise their hands

If an avatar is asked to do something they cannot, they will respond with: "The principal doesn't allow us to...", therefore prompting you to adjust your instructions. The AVATAR Lab can record your session and send it to you. We ask that all recordings are downloaded within 48 hours, otherwise they will be deleted.
